Insurance Updates

Due to changes with our insurance carrier, the following will take effect October 1, 2009.

The Certificate of Holder on all Certificates of Insurance will be the Red Knights International firefighters Motorcycle Club, Inc. Please make sure that you advise the local government where you holding the event to this fact. We will not list any city, town, state or province as the Certificate Holder.

Please submit ALL of the insurance information (locations, addresses, date(s) and additional insurers) when you request the insurance coverage, as there will not be any additional changes allow after the certificate of insurance is issued.

We can now offer insurance to chapters for their monthly meetings. The cost is \$167.00 per year. This does not cover a ride after a meeting, only the meeting itself. I will need the address of the meeting location and the dates for the year of the meetings. Our insurance coverage is on a year-to-year basis with the insurance year starting in April. Therefore, the coverage for monthly meeting is prorated if coverage is requested after April for the remainder of the year.

Trademarks

No trademark will be approved for any chapter that does not have an approved trademark for chapter business. All Chapters are required to have a chapter business trademark. This trademark allow the use of name/logo on chapter web site, business cards, letterheads, checks, address labels, newsletters, awards, chapter applications, awards and flyers (to promote the chapter only) to conduct chapter business.

Operation Iraqi Golf Balls Sending Sporting Supplies to Soldiers

One can just imagine the miles and miles One can just imagine the miles and miles of desert stretching like an ocean in Iraq, where U.S. troops are still roughing out their tours without most of the conveniences or pleasures they have at home. But a few Southern Marylanders are trying to give the troops a little more to do in their off hours.

Deelay Gude, part owner of Southern Maryland online (www.somd.com), has launched a new campaign with partner David Noss to send golf balls to troops stationed in Iraq, a mission that has grown out of the

in Iraq, a mission that has grown out of the launch of Web site's new Internet radio station (www.radiosomd.fm), which is gaining popularity with troops from the area stationed overseas.

"David had been working with some lo-cal guys stationed in Iraq to open a streaming port so they could listen to our radio station over there," wrote Gude in an e-mail. "Mike

Davis, a [Department of Defense] contrac-tor who works with soldiers of all ranks and nationalities in Iraq and is from St. Mary's County, mentioned that several of the camps

County, mentioned that several of the camps had set up a driving range for R&R and were having a hard time getting goff balls. He asked if we could round up some used balls and send them over ... so that's how Operation Iraqi Golff Balls came into being.

"The guys in Iraq contacted me directly to ask if we could help them round up the balls. I had worked with hem before trying get something in place so they could listen to radiosond fim while in Taq." wrote Noss in an e-mail about the collection. "They said they use somd-com all the time to stay in touch with their home. One guy actually e-mailed in a shout out to his wife on our first

touch with their home. One guy actually emailed in a shout out to his wife on our first
day of broadcasting, June 1," he added.

After Noss pitched the idea to Deelay
Gude, she said she started working with local sponsors to set up drop off locations. Gude
said that the station would be collecting as
many golf balls as they could get their hands
on from private donors, golf clubs and other
businesses through the end of July.

Gude said that the project has a personal
feel for her, because her son, Sgt. Doug Godon, is an Iraqi vet, as is his wife, Fessica.

"My son is indeed an Iraq vet and did a
tour in Afghanistan as well – both as military
and DoD contractor. He's done two tours in
Iraq, one in Afghanistan. And his wife, my

Iraq, one in Afghanistan. And his wife, my daughter-in-law, has done an Iraq tour as

well," she wrote.
"The balls will actually be shipped to several different camps, and our intention is to send them enough balls that they won't have to worry about running out for a long time," she explained. "What started out as a few

she explained. "What started out as a few golf balls has snowballed into a much bigger project because everyone thought it was such a terrific idea, and they want to get involved." Gude added that several local busnesses have expressed interest in helping pay for shipping costs, though only one busness has confirmed its pledge so far. The biggest force behind the project has been the individuals on the Web site's forums.

"People in our forums are really getting involved with this from nuttine out hoxes to

the Web sire's forums
"People in our forums are really getting
imolved with this, from putting out boxes to
helping with shipping... it's really become a
Southern Maryland Online community project. If you go to the Life in Southern Maryland forum at http://forums.somd.com/lifesouthern-maryland/, the top two threads are
about the golf ball collection," she wrote.

In the meantime drop boxes have already
been set up at Peoper's Pet Pantry in Solomons, Leonardtown Ford at both the new and
used dealership locations, and all Cedar Point
Federal Credit Union locations in St. Mary's
including the one at Pax River. Boxes will be
collected on July 31 for shipping.

It is with great sadness, I share this. Last Saturday morning, September 19,2009 Darrel Johnston (Active Member, RKMC Alberta 4) was killed in an automobile accident. He and 2 others were in a van on their way to work. The road conditions were terrible and as a result all three perished.

The funeral was September 26, the family requested an honorary escort by our club.

I pass this along to all who knew Darrel, he was a great Friend, Father and Husband he will be sadly missed.

I am Dana Maddox, Anthony's widow (it hurts to even say that word). I read in your summer 2009 issue that Ron McCary had reported that Anthony had been riding his motorcycle at the time he started having chest pains. That was incorrect; he was working on our property, doing landscape work on his Bobcat, when he began having chest pains. I rushed him to the hospital, but he did not survive.

I don't know if you can correct the summer issue, or if you would add this to your fall 2009 issue. Anthony was very dedicated to the Red Knights. He proudly wore his colors, and participated in every ride and event that he could (even after a motorcycle accident in 1999 that ended his firefighting career). He was also very active in recruiting new members to the Red Knights.

His career and lifelong love of firefighting began at the age of 16, when he joined the volunteer dept. in Glencoe, AL (our hometown). In 1984 we moved to Apopka FL, where he promptly joined their volunteer dept. In 1985 he was hired as a full time firefighter at Ocoee, FL (his dream realized). Then in 1986, we wanted to return home to AL, and he was hired full time at Anniston Fire Dept., where he served for 13 years, (until he had to retire due to his injury), and volunteered at Oxford Fire Dept. We later moved back to Glencoe, where he started out, and he returned to his hometown volunteer dept. During his years in the fire service he also became a Paramedic, was a member of the Glencoe Medic Dept., served as a reserve police officer for both of the cities of Glencoe and Hokes Bluff, AL, worked at the Talladega Superspeedway in fire protection and security, worked for the ambulance service in Gadsden, AL, and was a member of Anniston's Special Response Team. And he poured concrete with his dad in his "spare" time. Oh, and he also managed to raise two sons as well.

He died very suddenly at the age of 50. He loved life, and serving his fellow man. Several people told me that I should bury him in his Red Knight's vest, because he was always wearing it. But that was something I can never part with; it was so much a part of him, that I'll treasure it forever. I guess you can

tell, I loved this man dearly, and just wanted to ask if the

previous post could be corrected.
