#### Reminder to all Chapter Presidents International Membership Dues

Membership dues payable to the International run from January1st till December 31st of each year. A grace period for payment is granted from January 1st till February 15th. After that date dues are subject to a \$50.00 late payment fee.

#### 2010 Dues Rates:

There are nine classifications of membership:

- Charter Member An active member that has joined a chapter within one year of the chapter being chartered. See Section 4:08
- 2. Active Member – Is available to anyone who has been a member of the fire service, See Section 4:04
- 3. Associate Member – A person who has never been in the fire service. See section 4:05
- Social member The spouse, boyfriend (1) Girlfriend (1) offspring's of an Active or Associate member or member-at-Large. See Section 4:06
- 5. Special Honorary Member - Granted to a person of a recognized religion for the position of chapter chaplain. See Section 4:07
- 6. Member-at-Large – Person's who qualify for Active membership but are to far removed from any established chapter to join. See Section 's 2:01 & 2:01A
- 7. Life membership – See Section 2:01
- 8. Compassionate Honorary Member – See Section 2:01 (8)
- Junior membership See Section 5, Article 5:03 S.O.G's

Dues for new members joining a chapter shall be \$16.00 per member in their first year of membership and will be pro-rated at the rate of 25% reduction in the third quarter and 50% reduction in the fourth quarter.

Active or Associate Member \$13.00 each Social or Honorary Member \$7.00 each Compassionate Honorary Member no charge Junior Member no charge New member any classification \$16.00

Dues for chapters are to be sent in U.S. funds to the International treasurer: Please be sure to include a current membership roster which has the members Name, Address, Zip or postal code, Phone number including area code, and Email address if they have one. And lastly their membership status Active, Associate, Social, Honorary, Junior, Life or Compassionate Honorary.

Also be aware that it costs a little more than domestic mail to send a letter to me in Canada so check with your post office to ensure that there is enough postage on the envelope so that it's not returned to use for lack of postage.



Good day fellow Red Knights,

My name is Bob Laford, and I am president of Massachusetts Chapter 2. I am writing you today member-to-member to talk about *our* Red Knight Memorial in Boylston, Massachusetts.

Living in Massachusetts I am lucky that I and my chapter members are able to visit the memorial and enjoy its significance to us as an organization and to me personally as an individual Red Knight. That memorial is in place for each of us, the Red Knights who have already passed on before us, and the Red Knights that will come after us.

Leading up to the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration in 2007, founding members of our organization, members of Mass-1, developed the idea of this memorial on the grounds adjacent to the Boylston Fire Station. That location is significant for us because that is where the RKMC was founded and our journey began. The planning team for the memorial worked hard on design, site preparation, and fundraising to prepare the memorial for the Anniversary Convention that was to be held in nearby Worcester in August 2007.



As the convention date grew nearer it became clear that the fundraising to complete the memorial on time was going to fall short. The Red Knight's International Board stepped up and floated a loan so that the memorial could be completed on time for the celebration.

The dedication of our memorial in memory of those Red Knights passed was a very special day and consecrated this space for each of us.

In subsequent years many chapters and individuals have stepped up and contributed donations to the memorial fund to help pay off the loan. In 2007 \$4,100.00

was donated, in 2008 the figure was \$2,240.00, and for 2009 the donations have slipped to \$585.00. Unfortunately as we move away from the 2007 dedication the memorial moves away from our memory as well, currently leaving a balance of \$14, 900 on the loan



Along with this outstanding balance owed, there are still maintenance costs for the upkeep of the memorial. The members of Mass-1 care for the memorial, but there are costs that are associated with this care, and as we have members who pass away their names are added to the memorial each year.

To help with this piece of the memorial, the International Board set up funds in escrow to assist with continued care. In 2008 the Board also designed and began marketing a memorial patch to sell that reads "Red Knights"

Heaven-1." Along with the annual 50/50 raffle run at the International Conventions these patch sales are earmarked for the memorial's continued care.

We currently have 320 chapters and over 8,500 members (350 MALs). You can see that we could band together and easily retire this Red Knight debt both as individual and as chapters. For example, if each chapter were to run a fundraiser in its area and make a donation of \$100 that would pay off the loan and place a substantial amount of funds into the maintenance account to care for our memorial – and that does not even take into account any personal donations from individual members.



I am writing you today to ask that you join me and my chapter in making a commitment not to forget the memorial. You and I and our chapters and Members-at-Large can make a difference and take care of this financial burden. If you as an individual or as a chapter can make a donation to the memorial fund, please send your donation to International Treasurer Leo Patry at 6000 Battersea Rd.
