Reminder to all Chapter Presidents International Membership Ducs

Membership dues payable to the International run from January1st till December 31st of each year. A grace period for payment is granted from January 1st till February 15th. After that date dues are subject to a \$50.00 late payment fee.

2011 Dues Rates:

There are nine classifications of membership:

- Charter Member An active member that has joined a chapter within one year of the chapter being chartered. See Section 4:08
- Active Member Is available to anyone who has been a member of the fire service, See Section 1:04
- Associate Member A person who has never been in the fire service. See section 5:05 there is also a section for Fire department employees that are not firefighters.
- Social member The spouse, boyfriend (1) Girlfriend (1) offspring's of an Active or Associate member or member-at-Large. See Section 5:06
- Honorary Member Granted to a person of a recognized religion for the position of chapter chaptain. See Section 5:07
- Member-at-Large Person's who qualify for Active membership but are to far removed from any established chapter to join. See Section 's 2:01 & 2:01A
- Life membership See Section 2:01
- Compassionate Honorary Member See Section 2:01 (8)
- Junior membership See Section 5:09A, Article 5:03 S.O.G's

Dues for new members joining a chapter shall be \$16.00 per member in their first year of membership and will be pro-rated at the rate of 25% reduction in the third quarter and 50% reduction in the fourth quarter.

Renewing member's dues shall be: Active or Associate Member \$13.00 each Social or Honorary Member \$7.00 each Compassionate Honorary Member no charge Junior Member no charge

Dues for chapters are to be sent in U.S. funds to the international treasurer if using a U.S. Postal money order make sure it is an International Money order that can be eashed outside of the U.S. A.: Please be sure to include a current membership roster which has the members Nume, Address, Zip or postal code, Phone number including area code, and Email address if they have one. And lastly their membership status Active, Associate, Social, Honorary, Junior, Life or Compassionate Honorary.

TRADE MARK LICENCE AGREEMENT

All chapters must have a trademark license agreement to use the Red Knights Name or Logo there is a blanket license that permits the chapters to use the name and logo for chapter business forms such as letter head, business cards, etc. this must be applied for from the International secretary at secretary@redknightsmc.com. A policy effective January 1, 2011 has been set that any chapter not having a TMLA in effect by February 15th 2011 will be placed on restricted service till they are in Compliance.

EIN (Employer Identification Number)

All chapters should have an EIN this is a number required by the IRS and is needed to open a chapters bank account.

The practice of using a chapter member's private bank account or social security number is not a good business practice and puts that person at risk of additional taxation and possible blame if there is ever a question about finances.

The EIN is easy to obtain and the International treasurer can provide you with further reason to have an EIN and how to obtain one either on-line or over the phone, there is no cost to this and after filing out either the on-line form or answering the questions over the phone the EIN number is given to you and followed up with a letter from the IRS.

Once a chapter has an EIN they should contact the International treasurer so that the number can be registered in the chapter's files.

Membership cards can be obtained for the chapter members by ordering them from the International secretary at secretary@redknightsmc.com cards will be issued based on the total number of members in the chapter with a few extras for new members joining.

Another objective of the day was to see how well the chapter could run an event like this as practice for hosting the Red Knights International Convention in Prince Edward Island in 2014. By all accounts from vendors, members, presenters, and the Firefighters Association, the members of Chapter 1 were able to host a very successful trade show and annual meeting.

Thanks to the vendors in attendance and the sponsors for this event, RKMC PEI 1 exceeded its fund raising goal and was able to donate to the Firefighters Association a cheque for \$500
