Fall 2011 State Meeting

Eight Massachusetts chapters (out of 13) with 31 members were on hand for the Fall meeting hosted by Mass-4 at the Charlton FD on Saturday, October 22, 2011.

George reported that the Trademark License Agreement snafu has been resolved with the International Board. This allows the state representative to have a web page and related "business essentials" under a "TMLA." There had been disagreement as to whether an individual could have an agreement as opposed to an association. International VP Chris Gadway and Mass-4 President Tom Caisse fought on behalf of Massachusetts and the board finally authorized the TMLA for us during the 2011 convention meetings.

Other important business during the convention is the start of "electronic ballots" for the International Board. Starting in 2012 all board members will be elected by electronic ballots sent in by the chapters. There are specific dates and deadlines for candidates to follow to be on the ballot. Another change is that **ONLY** the chapters within a given

region will be voting for the Regional Rep for them. This is a change from allowing the greater membership at the convention the authority to vote the Regional Reps. For more details on these and other bylaw changes consult the International webpage.

MA-1 President David Hamilton reported that an architect is working with the Memorial Committee on how best to integrate the 9-11 steel to the Red Knights Memorial. It is stressed that it will remain the Red Knights Memorial and not a 9-11 memorial.

Steve Alvarez (Mass-3) visited NYC Twin Tower site this fall and spoke on its humbling and sobering emotional affect on visitors. He said he is looking at a 2012 visit that may include a larger group of Red Knights (possibly by bus).

Bob Felt (MA-8) was thanked for his years of service to the Red Knights as Assistant State Rep, and the membership voted in Bob Laford (MA-2) as the new Assistant State Rep for a two year term.

Chapter email address – The International Board has set up new RKMC email addresses for each chapter under "redknightsmc.com" If your chapter has not accessed this account and set up your individual password then this needs to be done.

The electronic voting will be ONE chapter ONE vote, and the information and ballot will be distributed via this email address. (There are some discussions that the host for these email accounts will be changing from Yahoo to the RKMC server). Red Knights Memorial



Resting on a flatbed trailer at a Sturbridge truck stop, the twisted, charred hunk of steel drew a steady stream of observers.

Men and women wearing red vests, leather motorcycle breeches and patches from dozens of fire departments gazed at the object with reverence as their parked motorcycles waited quietly to be revved up.

The artifact was a remnant of the 9-11 attack on the World Trade Center in New York. Bearing the numbers C-149 and N-176 that signify its role in the federal investigation, the thick, 5-foot-long piece of steel was part of a floor joist and truss support in the impact area between floors 94 and 98 of Tower 1, where one of the two terrorist commandeered planes hit.

Now the steel belongs to the Red Knights International Firefighters Motorcycle Club.

More than 100 Red Knights members from half a dozen East Coast states and Quebec, and their friends and family, mustered to escort the 9-11 relic to what will be its permanent home in front of the Boylston fire station.

[After the escorted process to Boylston] a six-man color guard carried the flag-draped steel to the memorial.

Now that the steel is in Boylston, a lasting installation incorporating it will be designed and erected at the memorial.

"This is a great and memorable occasion," said Rich Powers, a local Red Knights leader. "We're paying honor and respect to those who paid the price."

2012 International Dues

Membership dues payable to the International run from January 1st till December 31st of each year. A grace period for payment is granted from January 1st till February 15th. After that date dues are subject to a \$50.00 late payment fee.

There are nine classifications of membership: Charter Member, Active Member, Associate Member, Social member, Honorary Member, Member-at-Large, Life membership, Compassionate Honorary Member, and Junior membership. Refer to the International By-laws and SOGs if you have any questions about the different classifications.

Dues for new members joining a chapter shall be \$16.00 per member in their first year of membership and will be pro-

- rated at the rate of 25% reduction in the third quarter and 50% reduction in the fourth quarter.
- Renewing member's dues shall be:
 - • Charter, Active or Associate Member \$13.00 each
 - • Social or Honorary Member \$7.00 each
 - • Compassionate Honorary Member no charge
 - • Junior Member no charge
- Dues for chapters are to be sent in U.S. funds to the International Treasurer. Please be sure to include a current membership roster which has the members Name, Address, Zip or postal code, phone number including area code, and Email address if they have one. And lastly their membership status/classification.
- Dues may also be paid on-line using a major credit card but can only be done after a current membership roster has been received by the Treasurer who will then send a link to the chapter President or Treasurer for payment of dues on-line.

Liability Insurance Coverage through International.

If your chapter is going to apply for International insurance don't forget this new requirement: The International's insurance company for all chapters and associations requesting coverage for their events is now requiring a submission of the route of the ride with the request for insurance coverage. Any rider involved in an accident while not on the listed route will not be covered.



2011 marked the tenth year that the Red Knights hosted one of the Americade Three-course dinners!
