

Fall State Meeting

Massachusetts Fall State Meeting was held on Saturday, October 21, 2017, and was hosted by RK MA Chapter 4 at the West Brookfield Fire Department. Thank you to Mass-4 for their efforts and hospitality. Seven chapters and 35 members were present.

MA-4 Tom Caisse (International Nominating Committee Chairman) stated here are several international positions being voted on in the spring that will necessitate MA chapter votes. The only voting MA chapters will be involved in will be for Vice President and Secretary.



After a recent fun day of riding, we sat down together over a beer and debated which area in the world has the best motorcycle roads. This is often a passionate topic that elicits many different opinions. Since we ride all over the world, it was interesting to discuss the merits of various riding areas.

There are the Alps and Dolomites in Europe, which includes famous Stelvio Pass, topping out at 9,045 feet between Bormio in Italy and South Tyrol. With its 72 switchbacks, Stelvio is the highest paved pass in the Eastern Alps and provides riders with breathtaking views of the surrounding mountains. Central Europe is a veritable playground for motorcycle riders. It's an inspiring experience to ride these roads, but you share them with many other motorists as well as bicyclists.

Here at home in the US., the Pacific Coast offers miles of challenging and scenic routes. The Pacific Coast Highway is the perfect path to connect the best of the West, though it's a mental struggle between riding and at the same time wanting to stop and take in the stunning ocean views. And, of course, California has so many canyon roads that are exciting to ride, but watch for sand in the curves!

Another US. contender is in Arizona-the Coronado Trail (US. 191), with its endlessly fun curves and amazing views on a 90 -mile stretch between Alpine and Morenci. One of the best things about this road is that you usually have it almost all to yourself, as there is little traffic. There are dozens of iconic motorcycle destinations in almost every state-Montana, Colorado, Idaho, Arkansas, Ohio, and New York, to name just a few. In fact, many areas all across our beautiful country stand out because of the surrounding scenery, rhythm of the curves, lack of traffic, and/or inviting points of interest.

The Appalachian mountain chain, stretching from New York's Catskills to northern Georgia and Alabama, has innumerable splendid backroads, which we are still exploring. There are well-known mountain roads like the Blue Ridge Parkway, the Tail of the Dragon to the Back of the Dragon, and the Snake, but those are only the tip of the iceberg.

Considering the size of the riding area, the low volume of backroad traffic, and the good to excellent condition of the road surfaces, we concluded that the Appalachians offer the biggest playground for motorcyclists. The Southern Appalachians, which boast many of the highest peaks in the chain, have some of the best motorcycle roads found anywhere. The network of thousands of miles of curvy roads just goes on and on. There seem to be few wrong turns in these lush green mountains-at least that was our consensus. You should come see this playground for yourself!

That column stirred up some great memories for me, reminding me of places I have traveled and the sites I have seen. All because I ride, and many because I am a Red Knight. Maybe this brought back some memories for you of miles traveled in the past. Or maybe it got you thinking that there are some roads you want to travel still. Take out the map and start plotting your next adventure. Maybe it is somewhere close to home, in the next state, somewhere else in the U.S. or Canada. Or maybe, it's a trip to ride in a far off land. Make the plans, kick up some dirt, and go for a ride!

INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION -

Members of Mass 1, 2, 3, 4, 13, and 15 were part of the 570 members and nearly 90 chapters that participated in the 2017 convention in Syracuse.



Our hosts did a great job in entertaining us; from the hospitality room, self-guided rides and attractions, white water rafting, a group ride to Cooperstown, and much, much more. Red Knights from around the world, including U.S., Canada, England, Australia, Austria, Switzerland, Netherlands, Belgium and Germany, strolled and rolled into town throughout the convention week. Every time new arrivals walked into the Holiday Inn lobby they were greeted with hugs and cheers.

We were treated to a Friday night BBQ catered by the Dinosaur Barbeque, a great Italian flavored banquet on Saturday evening, and a going-away buffet for our Sunday breakfast. Syracuse is full of great restaurants too, and many were found to be colored red during the convention.

For Saturday's business meeting there were 88 voting delegates present. That is the largest number ever! (And there were a few more chapters present that did not attend the meeting). The Red Knights currently have

9,984 members in 437 chapters and with 368 MALs. We did lose 17 chapters this year through inactivity and another 6 chapters were formed by MALs. There was spirited discussion over a number of related bylaw changes that were all submitted by a member. The attendees decided to send most of those proposals to the Bylaw Committee for further review.

members from each of the nine countries represented stood with their country's flag as each National Anthem was played. There was also an emotional photo presentation of all the members who have joined the Heaven-1 chapter over the past two years.

Sunday was met with more hugs as we said goodbye. It was a great few days with friends, and we look to a new piece of Red Knight history starting with the purchase of land to protect our memorial and our future as an organization.

2018 — Pittsburg, PA is the location of the 2018 convention on August 16-19 at the Double Tree/Green Tree on Mannsfield Avenue. Both hotel and convention registration is open. "Like" the hosts FaceBook to keep up-to-date on planning and information.

NB and nearby Nova Scotia is some wonderfully picturesque scenery along the Bay of Fundy. Another convention that is a short distance from New England and the Northeast is sure to be a big turnout!

2022 — Southwest Pennsylvania will be the host for 2022 in Johnstown, PA. Full of history, Johnstown Red Knights in PA-22 are planning to incorporate history into your visit, including the Great Johnstown Flood, the region's steel industry, 9-11 memories, and a celebration of the Red Knights' 40th anniversary. Initial plans include an Ice Cream Social, a nearby Firefighter's Convention and parade, and the many staples that make our conventions a blast!

This corporation, *The Red Knights Memorial Foundation*, is a 501C3 non-profit foundation recognized by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Secretary of State's Office.

At the 2017 convention it was announced to the members that the RKMC has acquired the property adjacent to the Memorial's location. The Town of Boylston and the Red Knights are now in the process of planning for the separation of a piece of this Red Knight owned property so that the town may take possession of the rear portion of the lot to develop additional parking for the Boylston Town House. In kind, the town will sign over the parcel of land, owned by the town, where the Red Knights Memorial now sits.

This business/land transaction and the creation of the Foundation will ensure that the Red Knights Memorial is protected in place, and will be on land owned by the Red Knights.

During the convention in Syracuse pledge cards were handed out asking the membership of the Red Knights to become a part of the foundation and the protection of the Memorial for future generations. Pledged donations received prior to December 10, 2017, will be considered "Charter Donations" for the Red Knights Memorial Foundation.

All donations, of any amount are welcome and encouraged. Donations of \$100 will be considered "White Level," \$500 will be considered "Gold Level," and \$1000 or more will be considered "Red Level." Individuals and chapters making these specific donation amounts will be recognized on a plaque in the building on the property purchased by the Red Knights.

Plans under consideration for use of the building on the property include the potential for meeting rooms and display of Red Knight Memorabilia, among other RKMC sanctioned uses.

By the end of the RKMC Convention on Sunday, August 20, 2017, over \$27,000 in pledges had been made by those Red Knights in attendance. Please consider becoming a part of this effort to protect the Red Knights Memorial into the future.
