The attendance at the Red Knights regional rallies have been strong, and many times growing over the past years. But since COVID, attendance at Americade is not what it once was – and you can find parking anytime on Canada Street! And even Laconia Bike Week is suffering from this phenomenon, as this story from WMUR tells us. *Laconia Motorcycle Week sees drop in turnout due to economic factors. Laconia Motorcycle Week is underway, but organizers say attendance is down by 20-25% compared to previous years.*

*Organizers attribute the decline to economic factors, including the cost of gas and fewer tourists traveling south from Canada.*

*Staff at Vida Mexican Restaurant have also noticed fewer reservations during the event. "This year, it's a little more complicated with the motorcycles not coming," said Jose Sanchez of Vida Mexican Restaurant. "Last year, we had big reservations. This year we only have about 60 people."*

It is so good to get together with old friends and make new ones, each year.



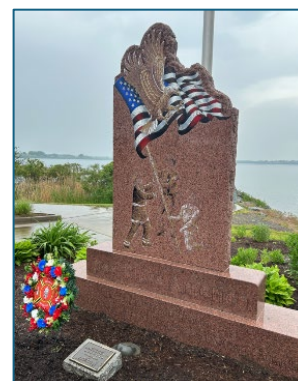

## Mass-2 Cover Bike

Steve and I traveled for several years on a 1984 Honda Gold Wing, before meeting some motorcyclists with red vests at a Toys for Tots ride in Burlington, MA. Low and behold, the Red Knights became our extended family. That was 30 years ago. We traveled to 19 conventions and to Lake George for Americade, for many years, together.

We had the opportunity to take a 3-week trip with Ed and Peg to Florida over to Texas and then back home. I had told Steve that I would not travel all that way on the 1984 Honda. So, in 1997 we bought our first brand new bike, a 1997 Honda Gold Wing and a trailer to tow behind holding our clothes and stuff. What an adventure for our first long trip which was not our last.

On our way home from the 2001 Convention in Winnipeg Manitoba, we had a crash that totaled the motorcycle (we only some road rash). A week or so after the accident Steve rented a Harley Davidson to get me back on motorcycle, but I was not that comfortable. We then purchased a used 2001 Honda Gold Wing. He traveled to Indiana with his dad to pick the bike up. Our adventures continued, traveling around the US.

In 2004 Steve bought a 2004 Harley Davidson Ultra Classic which he never told me about, until the morning we were taking a ride to Westminster to meet up with Mass2 for a ride. The bike entered many motorcycle shows after the 15 hand airbrushed murals were put on. Of course, he did not tell me about the artwork either. This bike was his pride and joy, winning a lot of first place trophies and ribbons.

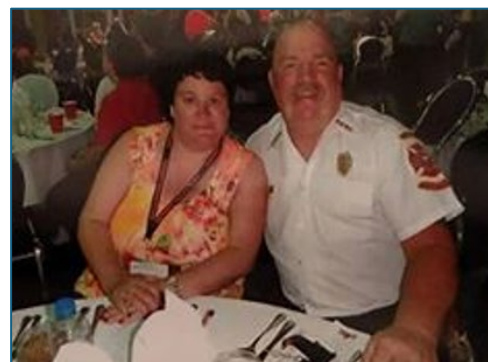
Now for the hard part. In 2014 I lost Steve to a motorcycle accident in Berwick Maine where he was headed to meet up with Cliff Eldridge to go fishing, but he never made it there. The 2004 Harley was totaled, but with the help of a very special Red Knight, Bob Binnall, managed to take a few parts off the bike that were not destroyed. A couple of those have since been put on his little fire truck trailer. A couple of other things were given to another friend that keeps an eye on me. (Bob calls me his second wife, and I travel to RKMC events with him and his wife Alex).

I have continued with the Red Knights since 2014 by going to the Dixie, Yankee, Western, Atlantic, Bootlegger and Scooter Rallies. I have traveled to most of the conventions except Austria and Germany. This year (2026) I will be traveling to the convention in Australia! I am meeting up with my Travelers in LA and doing some sightseeing in Sydney and Melbourne before the convention.

I have met so many Red Knights in my 30 years as a member and continue to meet them by traveling in my car to all these events.

My once in a lifetime adventure was traveling with my 3 married men (Bob Binnall, Ken May and Norm Beausoleil, yes their wives knew) around the USA in 2020 (during COVID) for the Founding Fathers Challenge Ride. The next year the adventure continued, finishing all the 48 states in the continental USA in one calendar year.

I tell people I have 5 husbands, a boyfriend, a bodyguard, a protector and 2 side pieces. All these guys watch out for me at all the events I go to. Without the Red Knights I am not sure where I would be. RKF RKF

Our May mid-week Hooky Ride was an opportunity to get into New Hampshire and

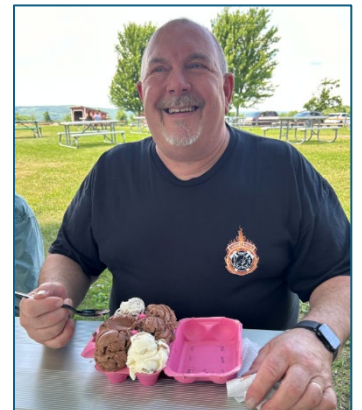


get six covered bridges in one swoop!

We know there are risks to riding, but there are some risks many riders never consider.

Not speeding.

Not reckless riding.

Something much more common.

**Micro-distractions.** Tiny moments that seem too small to matter.

- Looking down for navigation.
- Adjusting something inside the helmet.
- Fixing audio.
- Trying to hear directions.
- Removing a glove.
- Turning music louder to fight wind noise.

Each moment feels insignificant.

But when these micro-distractions stack up during a ride, they slowly degrade awareness.

Researchers found many crashes happen not because riders are reckless — but because their attention was briefly split at the wrong moment.

And at highway speed, that moment is devastating. One second equals 100 feet per second travelled blind.

Most riders believe they would notice danger instantly. But when attention is divided, the brain takes longer to react. Sometimes it is just long enough for something irreversible to happen.

If you ride often, you may recognize some of the habits immediately. And maybe recognize them in yourself!

## WHO, WHO, WHO... WHO ARE YOU?

Our newest member to MA-2 is Paul Britt of Shutesbury.

Paul just joined MA2 in the end of June of 2026. He is a firefighter with the Shutesbury Fire Department (for a little over 3 years). He told us that he is very active with the SFD in the fall and winter but when spring and summer roll in, his main job gets busy, and he is not able to respond as often. He heard about the Red Knights during some Fire Department multi-department trainings, through MA2 member Lonny Ricketts (Wendell F.D.).

Paul's favorite motorcycle memory was his first trip to Laconia, in 1998 with a close (but departed) friend. He tells us that he thinks back to that every time he goes to the event.



Outside of being a call firefighter, the bulk of his professional career was in automotive repair (22 years). He told us he needed a change from that and tried some carpentry and some landscaping but has landed working for the IATSE Union doing entertainment production set up and removal for the past 6 years.

Even though this job is busy in the summer, it does give him more free time placed throughout the days and weeks to fit in motorcycles, (his Electra Glide and an 883) than his past 9-to-5 jobs!
