## Bio of Richard Oliver

I have always had a personal mantra of Service to Others. Service to family, service to friends, service to community.

My wife Lori and I have been married for 34 years. We adopted three sisters in 1992 and now have five grandchildren ranging from three to fifteen years old. Our oldest granddaughter, Aalyiah, is a Junior Member of Massachusetts Chapter 2, and our dog Neva is our pseudo chapter mascot!



After an injury cut my career ambitions as a firefighter short in the early 1980's, I started that journey of what will come of my career? After several years trying different work, Lori and I bought a run-down convenience/liquor store and opened the New Salem General Store. That leap of faith solidified how I could serve my community. In over 25 years running the store, it grew to be a destination spot for tourists (and riders) and a treasure to the town. I retired from the business in 2020, handing over the reins to another local couple with similar service ambitions.



Becoming a storekeeper and the town's postmaster for a small New England town allowed me the opportunity to get to know my neighbors and be able to support the community, the townspeople, the school, and the police and fire departments over the years. In that time, they all had become like family.

From 2007-2017 townspeople came together with me and the store sponsored the "Hilltown Brewfest." Over the course of the ten years that this ran, the volunteers were

able to raise over \$70,000 that was given to the local fire departments.

The best thing Lori and I ever did as a couple was join the Red Knights. We have been members of Massachusetts Chapter 2 since 2007 (15 years). When we first joined, we thought it would be a good way to get out and ride with others, but it quickly became much more than that – it became family.

The fundraising efforts of the store have continued into the riding corner of our lives, as well. Working with MA-2 we were able to raise funds through a "Barrel Raffle" (finished Jack Daniels barrel) and give donations to the Ride for Kids, for several years. I also had the opportunity to support RKMC Founding Father Norm Beausoleil in garnering two barrels of Jack Daniels to sell

etched bottles with the proceeds going to the Red Knights' Memorial Fund. Over \$12,000 was raised through these projects.

In 2011 Lori and I had the opportunity to visit Red Knights in Europe and visited France-1 and Switzerland-1 and became instant friends.

When Vermont hosted the 2013 International Convention, Lori and I were able to repay the European hospitality and host members from Europe at our house prior to the convention. Members of MA-2 helped us plan and lead some rides for our visiting family and tour parts of New England, during their stay. Since then, we have had the good fortune to host many Red Knight friends in our home, which is always a joy!


